Diane's career includes nonprofit management, teaching, and fund development with a life-long commitment to programs that transform lives through education. Prior to joining Latino U College Access as Deputy Director in 2017, Diane served as the Executive Director for the Fairfield/Westchester County Chapter of the Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship (NFTE), a global organization that provides entrepreneurship education to low-income students in under-resourced school districts. Previously, she served for ten years as the Executive Director of Literacy Volunteers Stamford/Greenwich and as the Executive Director for The New York Public Library Centers for Reading and Writing, both adult literacy organization. Under Diane's leadership partnerships strengthened, programs expanded and revenues increased. Diane began her career as a middle school English teacher in Yonkers, NY.
