The strong collaboration of our Senior Staff team is an aspect of our synagogue's culture of which we are extraordinarily proud. We love taking turns on successive Fridays (with Cantor Becker) in getting to share Shabbat with our littlest friends in Mazel Tots. Cantor Becker and Rabbi Brown are active presences in supporting Rabbi Glickman's work in our Religious School. Rabbi Brown, Cantor Becker, Rabbi Glickman, Executive



Director Roberta Aronovitch, and Mazel Tots Director Jody Glassman start each week off together by strategically orchestrating the logistics of the week's calendar. Even as we lift up those areas where our collaboration is already strong, we are always on the lookout for new opportunities to study and work together.

It is in that spirit that we are writing to you this month to let you know about an important new initiative that the two of us have been invited to work on together.

The Jewish Education Project (JEP) is metro New York's central address for all things Jewish Education-related. It is the organizational gathering place for professionals and lay leaders of all denominational stripes to come together to explore innovative best practices in meaningfully fostering Jewish learning and identity development amongst students (of all ages!).

Earlier this year, JEP announced the formation of its inaugural **Leadership Initiative Pilot**, a fully funded professional development initiative for pairs of congregational educators and rabbis to spend a year studying and reflecting together about the dynamic relationship between Religious School transformation and transformation within our synagogue as a whole. We are delighted to let you know that Scarsdale Synagogue's application was accepted, and that our shared work on this important new project has begun.

Highlights of our year ahead will include:

- A series of in person and web-based learning opportunities with leading scholars and practitioners when it comes to transformative change processes in Religious Schools and Synagogues
- An opportunity for us to network with gifted colleagues from around the region who are grappling with the same questions we are. To that end, there will be mentored reflection spaces for Rabbi Glickman and her fellow congregational educators; and similar space for Rabbi Brown with his colleagues
- The chance for us to work together with an executive leadership coach so that the two of us can strengthen our (already strong) working relationship and construct a vision for the future of our Religious School that will complement the vision for the future of our synagogue
- The opportunity to implement that vision in the course of our future work in the coming months and years, in partnership with our lay leadership and staff colleagues

We are filled with gratitude: for the generous donors to JEP who are making this learning experience possible for us; for the JEP faculty with whom we will be privileged to learn; but most of all, to each and every one of you, for being fully invested in the ongoing strengthening of our entire synagogue. We will keep you posted in the coming months regarding the highlights that come out of this new endeavor. In the meantime, don't hesitate to let us know if you have any questions about this project, or any thoughts about how you'd like to become more involved in serving and supporting our Religious School and congregation.
